INTRODUCTION

Another edition of Digest of Local Government Statistics is being produced by the State Bureau of Statistics for the year 2020. The major aims and objectives of the publication is to present information on the activities of the sixteen (16) Local Governments, Local Government Training School, Ilawe - Ekiti and Local Government Service Commission, Ado - Ekiti.

The publication which is eighth (8th) in the series has eight sections covering Population and Land Mass, Personnel Records, Public Finance, Infrastructure/Public Utilities, Self Help/Community Development Projects, Hotels/Tourist Centres, Traditional Institution/Political Structure, Public Health, Agricultural products and others.

The data set and information on interconnection of basic socio-economic indicators affecting development at various Local Government levels were revealed. Some diagrammatic illustrations in form of graphs and charts were used for easy interpretation and understanding of the results.

The publication will definitely be of great significance to the Government, Researchers, Organized private sector and Local/International donor agencies.

SECTION ONE: POPULATION AND LAND MASS **POPULATION** 1.1

The section shows the population and land mass of all the 16 Local Governments in the State. Using the 2006 population census as base year, projection was done for 2019 and 2020 which shows that population of Ekiti which was 2,398,957 in 2006 rose to 3,665,798 in 2019 and further to 3,785,001 in 2020. Through all the years, Ado Local Government has the highest population of 521,323(14.22%) followed by Ijero Local Government with 334,573 (9.13%) and Ekiti West with 270,828 (7.39%) Ilejemeje has the least figure of 65,534 (1.79%). It is noteworthy that apart from Ikere and Efon Local Governments, the male population is higher than the female counterpart in all Local Governments therefore, the record shows that there are more male in the State than female. 1.2 LAND MASS

The total land mass of Ekiti is 5805.843km² out of which Ikole Local Government has the highest landmass of 874.94km² (15.07%) followed by Oye with 661.91km² (11.40%), Ado Local Government occupies 345.25km² (5.95%) as 9th in the rank and Ilejemeje Local Government has the least of 96.96km² (1.67%). The bar chart below illustrates further.



The distance (in kilometer) from each of the Local Government headquarters to the State capital shows that Ekiti East (Omuo) is the farthest with 64.65km followed by Ikole Local Government with 49.85km, Efon Alaaye is the third farthest with 47.00km while Ikere and Ekiti South West (Ilawe) are the closest towns to the State capital (Ado – Ekiti) with 13km each.

SECTION TWO: PERSONNEL RECORDS

2.1 PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION BY GRADE LEVEL

Information about the staff of the 16 Local Governments Areas in Ekiti State for the year was presented in this section with the staff strength of 12,856 out of which 1,572 (12.23%) were on GL 01-03, 3,035 (23.61%) on GL 04-06, 3,508 (27.29%) on GL 07-09, 3,045 (23.69%) on GL (10-12) and 1,678 (13.05%) in the management level. Out of the total number of staff in the Local Government Service, 6,387 (49.68%) were male and 6,469 (50.31%) were female. It was revealed that 35.84% of the workforce in Local Government Service were junior workers, 50.98% were on intermediate level and 13.05% falls to management level. It is noteworthy that the number of the female staff was 6,473 (50.35%) and their male counterparts 6,383 (49.64%)



2.2 PERSONNEL DISTRIBUTION BY NATURE OF APPOINTMENT

The table below shows that about 99.77% of the staff of the Local Government were on permanent appointment while just a minute percentage of 0.23 on contract basis, no worker is on volunteer corps.



SECTION THREE: FINANCE

3.1 **REVENUE**

The section shows revenue generated by each Local Government for 2020. It was observed that all the sixteen (16) Local Governments got most of their revenue from the Federal Allocation which stands at 69.75%, VAT was 16.21% followed by FAAC Augmentation of 10.63%, IGR 0.93%, Statutory allocation 0.005% and others 4.20%. 

3.2 **BUDGETARY ALLOCATION**

The Cumulative Budgetary Allocation for the 16 Local Governments shows that the Economic sector got 37.38%, Social Sector 25.88%, General Administration 31.84%, Environmental Sector 4.81% and others 0.09%.

3.3 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

Only Ekiti South-West Local Government expended above 50% of their allocation which was 57.85% all other Local Governments achieved far less than 50% of their capital budget for the year.

3.4 RECURRENT EXPENDITURE

In year under review, all the Local Governments performed above 50% with the exception of Emure Local Government that performed below 50% of their recurrent budget. See analysis table 3.1 for further details.



The table above shows the summary of the total roads network in all the sixteen Local Governments in the State by category in the year under review. It is worthy of note that existing road covered about 71463.57km (99.99%) out of which 107.63km (0.15%) were rehabilitated while additional 10km (0.01%) were newly constructed.

4.2 **VILLAGES CONNECTED BY ELECTRICITY, 2020**

The total number of towns and villages served with electricity was 81 out of which the State Government sponsored the connection of electricity in 18 (22.22%) towns/villages, Local Government sponsored the connection in 37 (45.68%) towns/villages, Benin Electricity Distribution Company (BEDC) sponsored the connection in 22(27.16%) towns/villages and community/ individual sponsored the connection in 4 (4.94%). 

The above table shows the sources of water being used in 807 communities in the State. As much as 451 (55.89%) communities depends on hand dug well, 119 (14.75%) communities used Bore hole, 74 (9.17%) communities relied on spring/stream, 37 (4.58%) communities have access to pipe borne water, while the communities that depended on river and solar powered boreholes were 65 (8.05%) and 49 (6.07%) respectively.

SECTION FIVE TOURIST CENTRES, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FACILITIES/INFRASTRUCTURES

The details of socio-economic amenities/infrastructures and enterprises across the Local Governments are contained in this section as shown in table 5.1 of the analysis table. It was revealed that Ekiti has a total of 55 pharmacies out of which Ado has the highest number of Pharmacies 35, followed by Irepodun/Ifelodun, Ikere and Gbonyin with 11, 10 and 7 respectively while Ilejemeje, Efon and Ekiti East has no pharmacy. There were 59 banks out of which Ado has the highest of 25, followed by Ikere and Irepodun/Ifelodun with 6 banks each, Ekiti East, Ekiti West, Emure, Gbonyin and Ilejemeje has the lowest number of 1 bank each while Ido/Osi has no bank. SECTION SIX: HOTELS AND TOURIST CENTRES

HOTELS 6.1

Table 6.1 shows that there were 134 functional and 2 non-functional hotels in Ekiti State in 2020. Ado Local Government has highest number of 41 hotels followed by Ikole which has 15 hotels, Ido/Osi and Oye has 14 hotels each while Ilejemeje has the least of one (1) hotel. 

6.2 TOURIST CENTERS

There were 26 functional tourist centers in Ekiti State in 2020 as contained in table 6.2 out of which Ekiti West Local government has the highest of 6 Tourist centers followed by Oye and Ado Local Government with 5 tourist centers each. Irepodun/Ifelodun and Emure Local Government also have 3 tourist centres each. Efon, Ikere and Ijero Local Governments have 2,1,1 tourist centers respectively while the remaining local governments have no tourist centers.

SECTION SEVEN: TRADITIONAL INSTITUTION AND POLITICAL STRUCTURE

7.1 TRADITIONAL INSTITUTION

Information in this section of the publication deals with the traditional settings and political structure in the Local Government areas of Ekiti State as at 2020. The distribution of traditional rulers shows that there are 36 (28.80%) first class traditional rulers, 33 (26.40%) second class traditional rulers and 56 (44.80%) third class traditional rulers. 

NEWLY ENTHRONED TRADITIONAL RULERS

There are nine (9) newly enthroned traditional rulers in Ekiti in 2020. Two (2) grade A rulers, one (1) grade B and six (6) grade C rulers.

Ekiti East and Ise/Orun Local Government have 2 newly enthroned rulers each while Ijero, Ikole, Gbonyin, Ido/Osi and Oye Local Governments all had one newly enthroned traditional ruler each.



The distribution of the 177 political wards in the State shows that Ado LG has highest number of wards being 13 followed by Ekiti East, Ijero, Ikole and Oye with 12 wards each while Ekiti South/West, Ekiti West, Ido Osi, Ikere, Irepodun/Ifelodun and Moba Local Government have 11 wards each and Efon Alaaye, Emure, Gbonyin, Ilejemeje and Ise/Orun Local Governments have 10 wards each.

Ado Local Government has the highest number of polling units of 207 followed by Oye with 190 polling units and Ekiti South/West Local Government with 188 polling units. Ikere has 87 polling units which was the least among Local Government Areas of the State.

Specifically, kolanut could be found in Ado, Ekiti West, Emure, Ijero, Ikere, Irepodun/Ifelodun, Ilejemeje, Moba and Oye Local Governments. Rice was predominantly found in Ikole, Ekiti West, Emure, Ikere and Irepodun/Ifelodun Local Governments.

Record also indicates that Cocoa could be found in Ado, Ekiti West, Ekiti South/West, Emure, Ido/Osi, Ikere, Irepodun/Ifelodun, Ise/Orun, Efon Alaye and Oye Local Governments while Oil palm is majorly produced in Ekiti South West, Gbonyin, Irepodun/Ifelodun to mention a few. To be specific, Ikere produces beans and Ikole produces teak. Oranges and vegetables could also be found in almost all the Local Governments of Ekiti State. See the above table for details.

8.2 HANDCRAFTS

The people of various Local Governments in the State are blessed with various handcrafts most of which are shown in the table below. Blacksmith is predominant in Ise Orun, Gbonyin, Ikere, Irepodun/Ifelodun and Moba Local Governments as mat weaving can be found in Ikere, Ilejemeje, Ekiti South/West, Ekiti West, Emure and Ijero Local Government. Also, pottery is notable in Irepodun/ Ifelodun, Oye and Ilejemeje Local Governments.

SECTION NINE: PUBLIC HEALTH

9.1 **HEALTH FACILITIES**

Information on health facilities across all local governments in the State for the year under review was shown in this section. There were 357 health facilities out of which Ado Ekiti has the highest number of health facilities in the State with 35 followed by Oye, Ekiti West, Ikere and Ikole local governments with 34, 31, 31, and 30 respectively. Ekiti East, Efon and Ilejemeje had the lowest number of health facilities 14,10,2 health facilities respectively. Out of the total of 357 health facilities rendering services at the primary level, 305(85.43%) are government owned and 52(14.57%) belong to private individuals or mission. Details can be found in the table & graph below.




